

LECTURER IN ECONOMICS AND FINANCE

The Lecturer in Economics and Finance will be responsible for delivering BA and MA courses in the following fields: **Economics and Finance**

Responsibilities:

- To teach up to two courses per semester at the undergraduate and/or graduate level
- To advise student theses
- To systematically conduct research in the relevant field or related disciplines
- To be engaged in the AAU community
- To represent Anglo-American University in academia as well as to the public, and to take part in university governance and academic development
- To be active in the organization of lectures and events and networking in the field

- Advanced degree (PhD) in a relevant field

- Strong professional record

- Ability to engage and integrate students into research activity
- Demonstrated excellence in teaching independently led courses and openness to innovative educational methods

We offer:

- Part-Time Contract (50% workload, equivalent to 20 hours per week: This includes a combination of teaching up to two courses per semester, conducting research, and fulfilling related responsibilities, such as administrative tasks.)
- Work at a prestigious university in an inspiring palace under Prague Castle
- Multicultural, international environment

- Friendly staff and colleagues
- Support of research grant application process
- Possibility to spread the teaching load across the academic year, including intensive winter and summer terms

Salary:

- CZK 35–70 000 gross (EUR 1400–2800, USD 1600–3150) or approximately CZK 28–54 000 net (EUR 1150–2150, USD 1250–2400) monthly for full-time employment, depending on academic rank (lower band for a proven research record, upper band for a full professor).
- Average salary in the Czech Republic is CZK 45 900 gross (EUR 1820, USD 2050). Cost of living: 1-bedroom apartment EUR 500-700/month (outside center–in center) (USD 600-800); 3-bedroom apartment EUR 900-1200/month (outside center–in center) (USD 1100-1400); meal in a restaurant EUR 6-30 (inexpensive–meal for 2 people) (USD 7-36).
- Healthcare insurance is automatically included.
- A work permit is not required for this position (standard Czech residency requirements apply).
- **Employment to begin preferably in the Spring semester 2025 (February)**

 - List of other academically relevant outputs in the field of expertise – public outreach, activity serving the larger community (consultancy, advising, reviewing, dissemination of knowledge, or other forms of engagement) etc.
 - List of courses taught and recent teaching scores (evaluations)
- Two reference letters will be required if you are shortlisted for the second round of interviews.
