






WELCOME


Year Timeline

FERPA

AAU acknowledges that parental and familial involvement remains significant even as a student transitions into college life. However, it is important to understand that the US Department of Education has instituted the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

According to FERPA, once a student reaches 18 years of age or enrolls in a post-secondary institution, such as AAU, the university is prohibited from disclosing information about the student to anyone, including parents or other family members.

FERPA's scope encompasses various aspects such as grades, disciplinary actions, billing, and financial aid. While parents or guardians naturally have a vested interest in their student's academic journey, access to the student's records is not automatically granted without the student's explicit written consent.

From the moment a student joins AAU, their records are safeguarded under FERPA regulations. At the start of their studies, but also at any point during their studies at AAU, students can review and adjust their privacy preferences which they can modify online at any time. Even after graduation, AAU remains committed to upholding the privacy settings last established during the student's enrollment.




Academics & Accreditations

As the first private university in the Czech Republic to use English as the language of instruction, AAU continually pushes students to achieve their highest potential.

AAU is the first institution in Europe to have received the prestigious WASC accreditation, an American accrediting agency that is recognized by the US government. This Accreditation allows for each of our students to graduate with an American degree and open doors to a vast global and educational market. AAU degree programs are also accredited by the Ministry of Education,

Youth, and Sports of the Czech Republic or the National Accreditation Bureau for Higher Education in the Czech Republic. This accreditation gives degrees obtained at AAU wide recognition throughout Europe due to the Czech Republic's membership in the European Union. This accreditation allows students the opportunity to graduate with an EU degree.











DEGREE STRUCTURE

Undergraduate degrees at AAU are 90 US credits, designed to be completed in three years when studying full-time. All programs culminate with a thesis project, allowing students to conduct research into a specific aspect of their studies and demonstrate mastery of the subject.

Our undergraduate programs follow a modular structure, composed of blocks of courses dedicated to achieving different learning outcomes. This variability allows students to take a more tailored approach to their studies.

NEW STUDENT MENTORS PROGRAM & STUDENT ORIENTATION

New students are welcomed to AAU during the week before classes each term, known as Orientation Week! This week helps students get to know their peers, and professors and become adjusted to campus life. Each year New Student Mentors help host orientation and act as friendly faces on campus for the remainder of their time at AAU.







REGISTRAR'S OFFICE

The Registrar's Office is equipped to help students with all things from health insurance and residency permits, to transferring credits or completing Recognition. Whatever it may be, the Registrar's Office is designed to support students from the moment they enter our community.





PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING SERVICES

AAU is proud to offer students on-site psychological counseling services from our registered psychologists. Each student is allocated four free sessions per semester to use at their discretion and more can be scheduled upon request.

Visa Procedures

Everyone's journey to AAU is different. If your student is not an EU citizen or Czech National and does not possess an EU passport, they will most likely need to obtain a visa in order to study in the Czech Republic.

AAU recommends that students reach out to their nearest Czech Consulate or Embassy as soon as they receive their admissions decision, to understand what documentation will be required and to ensure that they will have ample time to have their visa processed before the start of the semester.

Since documentation requirements and processing times can vary greatly by location and by student, AAU does not recommend receiving advice from individuals outside of your direct Consulate or Embassy, a trusted immigration lawyer, or the AAU Admissions Office.

If you or your student have concerns about the visa process, please contact our admissions department, who will be happy to direct you to the appropriate services.

The Admissions Office can provide information and basic assistance. However, they cannot replace a specialized professional organization dealing with visa and residence permit issues. We recommend considering one of the following providers should you feel uncertain about the process:

Foreigners.cz specializes in providing assistance with the visa process, residence permit, document translation and other services. If interested, please contact Foreigners.cz directly at prague@foreigners.cz. (It is a paid service, but there is a 10% discount for AAU students).

Pexpats is a local agency that offers specialized services for students including visa applications, acquiring health insurance, opening bank accounts, relocation, nostrification, and many more which can all be completed on your behalf for a fixed fee. You can contact them at info@pexpats.com. (It is a paid service, but there is a 20% discount for AAU students).

HEALTH INSURANCE

Ensuring your student has appropriate health insurance while attending AAU is crucial for their well-being. Below is some essential information to help you navigate the insurance options and requirements:

Insurance Provider Options

Students applying for a long-term visa or stay in the Czech Republic can now choose from multiple authorized insurance providers. While PVZP remains a reliable option, other recommended providers include AXA and SV Pojišťovna.







Increased Indemnity Limits

The coverage limit for health insurance has been significantly increased to EUR 400,000 per insured incident. This enhancement offers greater financial security in case of medical emergencies.

Your child's health and well-being during their stay in the Czech Republic are our top priorities. We are here to help you every step of the way.

Comprehensive Coverage and Pre-existing Health Conditions

Comprehensive health care coverage includes essential medical services, hospital transfers, hospitalization, prescription medications, repatriations (with limits), and emergency care. Dental care is also covered up to specified limits. It is important to note that the comprehensive coverage options assume a full state of health without pre-existing conditions. If you have a pre-existing health condition that you wish to have covered, please be aware that PVZP is the only company currently offering this option for an additional charge, subject to their assessment.

MAKING APPOINTMENTS

Students with PZVP medical insurance seeking a doctor or scheduling appointments should always use the provided assistance line. Failure to make this call may result in denial of medical expense claims. Assistance service will schedule the next available appointment with the doctor or specialist you need.

Diploma Recognition

At AAU, we offer dual degree programs that grant both U.S. and European (EU) degrees. In order for some students to be eligible for the EU degree track, their prior education must go through a process called Diploma Recognition.

Recognition is a formal comparison of a student's foreign* education to a comparable level of Czech education to confirm that it meets the necessary standards. A student's academic background will be evaluated against Czech secondary or bachelor-level education to determine their equivalency.

The recognition process is unique to each student, and AAU is here to support you and your student every step of the way. The Assistant Registrar can guide your student through the process and answer any questions your student might have. Students are encouraged to initiate recognition upon arrival at AAU by contacting the Assistant Registrar.

There are several key advantages to graduating with both U.S. and EU degrees, such as:

- The ability to work as a student
- Multiple-month visa-free stay in the EU for job searching postgraduation
- Ability to participate in Erasmus And more!





Students who hold certain high school diplomas are exempt from the recognition process. These include:

- Czech High School Diploma ("vysvědčení o maturitní zkoušce")
- German High School Diploma ("Zeugnis der Allgemeinen Hochschulreife")
- Hungarian High School Diploma ("érettségi bizonyítvány")
- Polish High School Diploma ("świadectwo dojrzałości")
- Slovak High School Diploma ("vysvedčenie o maturitnej skúške")
- Slovenian High School Diploma ("Spričevalo o Splošni/Poklicni maturi")
- European Baccalaureate Diploma
- International Baccalaureate Diploma
- Czech, German, Hungarian, or Polish University diploma,
- Slovak University Diploma (with the exception of diplomas issued by Czech branches of Slovak universities after March 28, 2015)
- Slovenian Master's Diploma
